NHA laud public support on ‘Keep Honiara Clean’ Campaign

The National Hosting Authority (NHA) has applauded Honiara residents for the support shown and rendered towards the Government in the drive to clean-up and beautify the host City for this year’s Sol2023 Pacific Games.

Since the launch of the ‘Safe & Green Games’ Strategy on Friday March 3rd, residents representing different sectors of and within the City have actively taken part in the Keep Honiara Clean Campaign.

The Safe and Green Games Strategy is ‘a whole of society,’ plan that provides a platform for the National Government, the Honiara City Council, the Guadalcanal Provincial Government, the Private Sector, Churches, Schools, Civil Society Organizations, Community Groups and Individual households to unite as one team for one common purpose – to clean, beautify and keep Honiara City Safe and Clean for the Games.

NHA Board Chair, Dr Jimmie Rodgers thanked the nation, particularly Honiara residents for supporting and getting on board with the Games through this campaign.

“I would like to convey our thanks to the nation, to the government, to the public particularly the public here in Honiara – they have come on board with the ‘Keep Honiara Clean’ campaign.

“To all those public servants and private sectors we would like to thank you all.

“Thank you, Honiara City Council, for ensuring and making sure that our drive to make and keep our City clean is achieved.”

Dr Rodgers said that it is encouraging to see Solomon Islanders take pride and ownership of the City by helping keep it clean in the lead up to the games.

He added that it is equally important to maintain this during and after the Games.

“When people come to this country, they will not only be focusing on the Games, they will not just be focusing on medals, they’ll be reporting either how dirty or how clean this City is. This will also determine how we promote our tourism industry.

“Therefore it is very important that we the public of Honiara, the public of Solomon Islands continue to take pride and have ownership over our City, because the only way we can have others enjoy and be proud of it as we do is to make sure that it is clean, beautiful and safe for when our athletes come in,” Dr Rodgers said.

Meanwhile the Keep Honiara Clean campaign continues in Honiara, with all sectors assigned various clean up zones that they tend to every Friday. This will continue until Games time.



Honiara launch 'Safe & Green Games' Strategy

Honiara, the host City for the 2023 Pacific Games this month official launched its "Safe and Green Games" Strategy, an initiative aimed at cleaning up and beautifying the national capital of Solomon Islands in preparation for the Games, come November and December this year.

More than 2000 residents representing all sectors within the host City took part in the launch event early this month. They include; staff from all 24 government ministries, private sector, churches, civil society groups, Honiara City wards, schools and the general public.

The Safe and Green Games strategy is 'a whole of society,' plan that provides a platform for the national government, the Honiara City Council, the Guadalcanal Provincial government, the private sector, churches, schools, civil society organizations, community groups and individual households to 'unite as one team' for one common purpose, to clean and keep Honiara city safe, and clean' for the Games.

Giving the keynote address at the launch, Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare outlined the key objectives of the Safe and Green Games Strategy. They include:

- Providing a safe and secure environment in Honiara City and to support the Government in successfully hosting the Sol2023 Pacific Games.
- To beautify Honiara City and achieve a long-lasting legacy that will live on beyond the Sol2023 Pacific Games for the benefit of Solomon Islands' future generations.

Commending the fine turn-out for the launch event, the Prime Minister said that it is encouraging to see Honiara residents take pride and ownership in starting to clean up and beautifying the city.

"I am incredibly happy and excited to witness the turn-out from students, youths and fellow citizens, residents and

partners here at this important event. It shows that we care for our City – our country. Let us work together. Let us share responsibilities. This is our city. This is our country. It is our collective responsibility to beautify our city," Sogavare said.

Prime Minister Sogavare said that Honiara will receive its largest number of international arrival during the Games in November and December this year.

"From the 12th of November to 3rd December this year, Honiara will receive the largest-ever number of overseas visitors of more than 8,000 people to our shores in three short weeks. Almost 5,000 will be athletes and officials from all participating countries and the rest will be relatives, supporters and tourists.

"These eight thousand plus people will broadcast to the world their impressions and perceptions of the country, especially their impression of Honiara city. Already Honiara is regarded as one of the 'dirtiest cities in our region' with rubbish and betelnut stains everywhere."

The Prime Minister said that it is the sole responsibility of all Honiara residents to ensure that the city is clean and safe in the lead up, during and after the Games this year. He added that everyone should work together towards ensuring this.

"I am sure you will agree with me, that this is not the image of our country we wish our visitors to take back with them when they depart from our shores after the 2023 Pacific Games. We want each of our visitors to have a pleasant and memorable experience of our country and our capital city from the moment they step off their flights on arrival until the moment they board their flights to take them home. To achieve this, we must work together in the next 262 days to ensure our city is safe, green, and clean."

The launching programme was followed by a general clean-up around the city from White River zone in the West to Henderson zone in the East on Saturday 4 March and concluded on Sunday 5 March with inter-denominational church service on Sunday 5 March.



GAMES PREPARATIONS ON TRACK, EIGHT MONTHS OUT

The end of March brings Solomon Islands and the entire Pacific region eight months closer to the much anticipated, historical Sol2023 Pacific Games in Honiara, Solomon Islands.

From November 19th to December 2nd, the City of Honiara will play host to 5000 plus athletes and officials here for the Games.

Speaking at a press conference hosted for the visiting Pacific Games Council (PGC) President, Vidya Lakhan and CEO, Andrew Minogue, NHA Board Chairman Dr Jimmie Rodgers assured Solomon Islands and the region that all Games preparations are on track and will be ready before the start of the Games.

“From our own assessment, we believe we are on track with facilities and all other areas of preparation. Everything will be completed before the Games. We have assurance from the Government that their contributions toward the Games will be paid in by August in instalments – that in itself is a big positive for us. Our preparations are in good shape and we will be ready in time for the Opening Ceremony of the Sol2023 Pacific Games,” Dr Rodgers said.

The visiting PGC President, Mr Lakhan said that he is satisfied with the preparations and is confident Solomon Islands and the GOC will deliver a great Games as promised. Following a site visit of all the venues, Mr Lakhan said, “We were quite impressed with the amount of work that has gone on from November last year to date.



“We left here November last year, knowing fully well that all the facilities will be handed over to the GOC well ahead of time, and I am happy to say that we are still on schedule on getting all of the facilities up and running before the Opening Ceremony on November 19th.”

Mr Lakhan added, “We are quite satisfied and we will be leaving your shores in the knowledge that we are in good hands and good space and when we do come back in August, things will have improved considerably.”

During their brief stay in the country, President Lakhan and CEO Minogue held brief meetings with Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare, the Honiara City Mayor, the Chinese Ambassador, NHA Board and the GOC regarding means of ensuring Honiara is clean for the Sol2023 Pacific Games.



CHINA ASSURES SI GOV'T OF TIMELY DELIVERY OF GAMES INFRASTRUCTURE

The People's Republic of China (PRC) has assured Solomon Islands that all China funded Games Infrastructure will be completed and ready in time for the Sol2023 Pacific Games this year.

The Chinese Ambassador to Solomon Islands Li Ming, reassured Solomon Islands Prime Minister, Manasseh Sogavare of this during a brief meeting this month in Honiara.

"All the Games infrastructure facilities that China is financing will be completed and handed over to NHA (National Hosting Authority) in August 2023, in time for inspection and testing.

"This gives sufficient time for the Games Organizing Committee (GOC) to take exclusive possession of the venues around October 2023 to prepare the venues to run the 24 sports programs at Games time."

Ambassador Li said, "The Chinese contractors CCECC construction, the PG2023 Stadium projects and JPC

constructing the PG2023 Games Village, SINU Dormitory project have reaffirmed their commitment to complete the two projects by August this year."

He added that the projects are the perfect gift from the Chinese Government to the Government and People of Solomon Islands.

"This is the perfect gift from China to Solomon Islands, as a symbol of our friendship and support towards Solomon Islands' hosting the Sol2023 Pacific Games."

Prime Minister Sogavare in his response said that he is satisfied with the progress made, stressing on the importance of the project to the government and its significance to the people of Solomon Islands.

"It is important to note the benefit local Solomon Islanders get from the projects from local international events using the facilities after the 2023 Pacific Games."

Meanwhile, President of the Pacific Games Council Vidhya Lakhan said he was satisfied with the progress of the projects, thanking the Government and people of China for the generous support on behalf of the 22 members of the Games Council.

"I am pleasantly surprised and amazed by the amount of work the contractors have done over the last four months. We are quite happy and confident Solomon Islands will be ready for Sol2023," he said.

GOC host buffet for Games Sponsors

Call it the 'PACIFIC GAMES'



Solomon Islands will host the region's biggest ever sporting event, the 17th edition of the Pacific Games in Honiara come November and December this year (2023).

The Pacific Games (formerly known as the South Pacific Games or SPG) was established in the 1960s by the then South Pacific Games Council (now the Pacific Games Council) with the vision to promote a unique, friendly world-class competition and Games to develop sport for the benefit of the people, the nations and the territories of the Pacific Community.

"The South Pacific Games was established with the view to creating bonds of kindred friendship and brotherhood amongst people of the countries of the Pacific region through sporting exchange without any distinctions as to race, religion or politics. The South Pacific Games was to ensure the efficient promotion and development of sports amongst the South Pacific Nations and their peoples," as stated in the event's historical brief.

In 2006, a new Charter and name was agreed upon at the General Assembly in Apia, Samoa; the Pacific Games Council (in place of the South Pacific Games Council) and the Pacific Games (in place of the South Pacific Games). The name South Pacific Games was officially changed to the Pacific Games after the 2007 Games in Apia, Samoa. Since its change of names, the Games Charter also had to be revised and modernized in light of changes in the region and the change place of Sport in our society.

A statement from the PGC website stated; "the Pacific Games as it is now known, proceed into the future as the physical representation of the Pacific Communities as they move forward from the first South Pacific Games in Fiji in 1963. The Pacific Games maintain a high

standing within the Regional Sporting Calendar and a growing reputation for sporting excellence.

Laurel Tasa, the 2023 Pacific Games Organizing Committee's (GOC) Senior Manager of Marketing and Communications said that everyone needs to start getting used to calling it the Pacific Games - and not South Pacific Games or SP Games.

"It is important that our people who will be the host of these Games are able to familiarize and understand the significance of this name change. Since the Apia General Assembly in 2006, it (the Games) is no longer the South Pacific Games (SPG) as many refer to, but officially the Pacific Games," she said.

Meanwhile the GOC's Community Engagement team have continued to raise awareness throughout the country through the Games Mascot nationwide tour and the recently launched Games Ambassadors tour.

"We are continuously raising awareness throughout our communities in the provinces and here in Honiara on the Pacific Games. We do hope that it will help improve people's understanding about the region's biggest sporting event - the Pacific Games," Ms Tasa said.

This year's Pacific Games will be held from November 19th to December 2nd, 2023. It will feature a total 24 countries, competing in 24 sports and expected to draw in more than 8,000 plus visitors and athletes during Games time.





GOC launches Sol2023 Games Ambassadors Programme

The 2023 Pacific Games Organizing Committee (GOC) officially launched the Sol2023 Games Ambassadors Programme this month.

Part of GOC's Community Engagement Strategy, the Games Ambassadors programme is aimed at informing communities around the country about Sol2023, and inspiring young Solomon Islanders to participate and be part of sports.

The programme also provides sports awareness and advocacy of the pathway from local villages and competitions to the grandest stages such as the Pacific Games that young local athletes can dream and aspire to achieve in their careers.

This month GOC officially announced nine retired and current local prominent sportsmen and women who will be implementing the programme throughout the country as Games Ambassadors.

They include; Athletics Icons: Jim Marau, Chris Votu and Primo Higa, former national Footballers turned Coaches: Batram Suri and Timothy Inifiri, Paralympian: Hellen Saohanga, Weightlifting Queen: Jenly Wini, Boxing Icon: Joseph Saimei and national Tennis Player and Coach: Junior Benjamin.

"The Ambassadors are representatives of every one of our provinces. They are elite level athletes who not only aspire to participate at the highest level, but have fulfilled and achieved their potentials in reaching the pinnacle of their sporting careers.

"They are a full representation of Solomon Islands and of what Solomon Islands can do and achieve in sports." Mr Stewart explained that through the programme, the Games Ambassadors will be touring all provinces

in country, sharing their sporting experiences and expertise to inspire the next generation of elite athletes in the country.

"We are looking to inspire particularly the young children of Solomon Islands. The next generation of elite athletes to continue aspiring to reach the highest sporting levels they can potentially reach and achieve.

"Our Ambassadors embody that aspiration. They are people who can stand up in front of their families, friends, the people of their communities and share their experiences, be a living testament of how one can aspire, reach and achieve the highest levels and accolades in sport they can achieve through hard work, dedication and sacrifice.

"That is what we are looking to do with our Ambassadors through this programme," he said.

GOC Board Chairman, Martin Rara commended the nine Ambassadors for partnering with the Sol2023 Pacific Games and its preparations, adding that they will be the face of the Games and that their involvement will connect people throughout Solomon Islands to the Games.

"As Games Ambassadors, you are the voice, the face, the legs of Sol2023 into the communities.

"You will be going out there as sporting icons of this country. Whenever people see you, they will see Sol2023 Pacific Games. The messages that you will pass and relay to our communities will inspire others to aspire and achieve greatness as you all have achieved.

"I believe that as you tell our communities about Sol2023 and of your success stories, our people will understand,



accept and get the message directly from you as someone who has been to the Games, experienced the Games and had been part of the Games.

“This I believe will get Solomon Islands behind the Sol2023 Pacific Games,” Mr Rara said.

Meanwhile the first Ambassador tour to Central, East and North East Guadalcanal was completed this month by Solomon Islands first and only 100m SPG (Pacific Games) gold medallist and Sol2023 Games Ambassador, Jim Marau. (More on our next issue).

Solo completes PG2023 Mascot nationwide tour

Solo, the 2023 Pacific Games (Sol2023) Official Mascot has finally completed its nationwide tour of Solomon Islands this month (March).

Solo's six-month long nationwide Games voyage had taken the fuzzy yellow, fan-loving Games Mascot as far west as the Shortland Islands to Temotu in the eastern Solomons. Solo toured all nine provinces; Choiseul, Western, Makira Ulawa, Rennell and Bellona, Isabel, Central Islands, Guadalcanal, Malaita and Temotu provinces. Solo also visited schools in Honiara.

Set out as phase one of the Games Organizing Committee's (GOC) Community Engagement Strategy, its aim was to engage, educate, advocate and raise awareness about the Sol2023 Pacific Games which will kick off in Honiara from 19th November, to 2nd December this year.

"Getting the Games message out to as many people throughout the country as possible was indeed the prime objective of this strategy. Providing and sharing vital Games information, raise awareness and help improve people's understanding about the Games and the legacy benefits that come with hosting the Games.

"These were the key aims of this strategy that I believe Solo and the team has achieved since debuting at the Guadalcanal Day celebrations at Tenaru, August 1st, last year. Since then Solo has been the most popular national figure throughout the country," Laurel Tasa, GOC Senior Manager, Marketing and Communication said.

Tasa added that since its first public outing, Solo has generated thousands of followers on social media and requests for Solo special appearances received in Honiara. A brief analysis of the Sol2023 XVII Pacific Games Facebook Page had seen a hike in its reach since Solo's public debut seven months ago.

GOC Media Officer, Ezmie Oge shared similar sentiments. "We have had a lot of likes, following and public interaction on the Games Facebook page since our team



first provided coverage on Solo's tours on social media. Many have been following Solo throughout the whole nationwide tour. Solo has helped us raise awareness about the Games throughout the whole country." GOC Community Engagement Coordinator, Jacquelyn Maeli said the Mascot nationwide tour was an eye opener and a success at all fronts.

"Taking Solo out for the first time was something new, something different, a whole new experience that we were hyped about, and didn't know what to expect from. The tour was an eye-opener for many of us and for all of Solomon Islands. We have had nothing like this on our shores, our doorsteps as far as I can remember. It was a learning curve for many of us, taught us a lot about planning, organizing and implementing this program.

"All in all, the nationwide mascot tour was truly a success. Everyone knows Solo, everyone loves meeting Solo and most importantly, everyone knows Solo is a representation of the Sol2023 Pacific Games," Jacquelyn said.

Meanwhile, GOC this month officially launched its Games Ambassadors Program whereby a total 10 former and current athletes have been engaged to provide awareness and advocate for sport throughout Solomon Islands. The Ambassadors tour started on Guadalcanal before moving on to shortland islands and other provinces in the country.



Achieving High Quality, Embracing Games Legacy

The Construction of a natural turf field for the 2023 Pacific Games presents our country with the challenges of keeping the turf to meet Football and Rugby International standards.

This means our country must have trained local personnel to manage the turf by having the right type of grass and fertilizer to grow the turf and the right equipment to maintain the fields in preparation for PG2023 and beyond the Pacific Games.

As part of ensuring the maximum impact on the Sol2023 Games legacy the National Hosting Authority engaged Regional Turf expert Mr. Laurie Stubbing as a consultant to advise and guide the NHA and Games Facilities Committee on the development of natural turf to meet rugby and football fields international standards in time for the 2023 Pacific Games from the 19th November to 2nd December 2023.

The NHA contracted the New Zealander given his vast knowledge, experience and his distinguished track

record of successful turf works within many countries across the region.

Since his engagement, Mr. Stubbing, has been training a local Turf Assistant Mr. Dickson Ramota Riikwao who has been working closely with him and together are working closely with the contractors to ensure the natural grass fields that are prepared for the 2023 Pacific Games meet the required international standards.

NHA has is preparing the country to manage the fields post games by ensuring that turf works is enhanced with the support of proper machinery are procured including: Seed spreader, Chemical Sprayer, a Tractor with specialized attachment's, A specialized Baroness Mowing machine used for turfs and other smaller support tools for occasionally maintaining the turf.

The venues are still under the responsibility of the contractor until they are handed over to NHA after completion at around end of July 2023. NHA is therefore pleased that the contractor is willing to share information as part of building local capacity.



High Commissioner Hilton visit Tenaru and DC Park

NHA to support HCC on clean-up campaign.

The National Hosting Authority (NHA) with the support from the National Government will enter into a partnership agreement with HCC to support clean-up programs within respective wards within Honiara City from now till the games.

This is part of the Safe and Green Games which was launched Friday March 3, 2023.

As part of this partnership NHA will also support HCC in efforts to manage the Ranadi Rubbish dumpsite.

A similar partnership is also being considered for Guadalcanal Province for the area between KGV1 school and Honiara International Airport.

Meanwhile, NHA and GSIC (Government Services Integrated Committee) are in discussion with private sector organizations to support the Keep Honiara Clean Campaign.

The Safe and Green Games campaign also provides a platform for the National Government, the HCC, Guadalcanal Province, Private Sector, Churches, schools, CSO, Community groups and individual households to unite as one team for one common purpose and that is to make Honiara safe and clean.

The clean-up campaign will run from now until November 2023.



Sol2023 Football Facilities to be completed by August

Football facilities to be used at the Sol2023 Pacific Games this year will be completed by August, 2023.

The National Hosting Authority confirmed that construction work done on the football training grounds at the new SIFF (Solomon Islands Football Federation) Academy is on schedule and will be completed in time for the Games, come November and December this year. "NHA through its facilities committee is on track to deliver the PG2023 Football training field and other sports facilities at the new SIFF Academy at KGV1," a statement from NHA Communications read.

This is part of a multi-donor project co-funded for by the Government and People of Papua New Guinea and the Government and People of Japan, with support from the Solomon Islands Government.

The project consists of a Multi-Purpose Futsal Court, an Office and Administration Building, a Dormitory, two Soccer Playing and Training Fields, a changing Room and a Beach Soccer Field.

"This is the largest SIG Project to be given to a local contractor, providing jobs for locals as well as building capacity of the local engineers and construction workers. It is constructed by JED Enterprise, a locally owned Construction Company.

"We are confident everything will be completed by August 2023, before the Opening Ceremony in November," the statement said.

The Solomon Islands Government through NHA acknowledged its partners for their tremendous support towards the development of the Sol2023 Football Training Field and the new SIFF Academy.

'SOLO' the Leatherback visits 14 Pacific Islands Countries

'SOLO' the leatherback turtle has over the past month visited 14 of the 24 Pacific Islands countries that will take part at this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games.

Satellite tracking updates provided by The Nature Conservancy (TNC) showed that since departing Solomon Islands waters early this year, Solo the leatherback has thus far visited; American Samoa, Australia, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Niue, Norfolk Island, Samoa, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu and Wallis and Futuna.

Peter Waldin, acting Director for TNC Solomon Islands for leatherback satellite tagging said, "Solo and her nine sister-cousins are fantastic ambassadors for the Pacific Games.

"The ten turtles have now visited the waters of 14 of the 24 participating countries – Solomon Islands, American Samoa, Australia, Fiji, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Niue, Norfolk Island, Samoa, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, and Wallis and Futuna."

TNC Solomon Islands is the official sponsors of the Mascot Naming Competition last year. This partnership aims to advocate against the illegal harvesting of all turtles throughout the Pacific Region. (Check out our next edition for more updates).



AFP, RSIPF launch Policing Partnership for PG2023

The Australian Federal Police (AFP) Officers this month joined their counterparts from the Royal Solomon Islands Police (RSIPF) to launch a Policing Partnership Program (RAPPP) for the 2023 Pacific Games.

The programme is to help with “operational readiness and security planning” before the Games in November. Officers were joined by members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF) for a clean-up of woodland areas around the police headquarters at Rove, Honiara, as part of a programme of activities to set the RAPPP in motion. “The AFP has a long-standing and well-established partnership with the RSIPF and we look forward to continuing this in the planning, testing and operation for the Pacific Games,” AFP Commander Solomon Islands Heath Davies said.

“The AFP continues to support capacity building within the RSIPF and is ready to provide specialist capabilities and support throughout the operation, in partnership with the RSIPF.”

The official launch of the Pacific Games initiative included a parade towards the Lawson Tama Stadium, which is set to stage football during the Games.

Participants included Australian and Solomon Islands police officers. Later this month, officers from the Solomon Islands are set to travel to Canberra to take part in an observer programme with Australian police.

The visit is designed to enable them to “focus on the planning and operational running of major events in a real time environment.”

The 2023 Pacific Games is scheduled to open on November 19 and is expected to feature 5,000 participants from 24 Pacific Island countries and territories including Australia and New Zealand.

RSIPF, CPLT complete PG2023 Security Planning Workshop

Officers from the Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) 2023 Pacific Games Planning Team, have completed a Security Planning Workshop conducted for by China Police Liaison Team (CPLT) this month.

The workshop provides frameworks for security planning and security risk management aimed at ensuring Police and its partners provide top notch security services at the Games this year.

CPLT Deputy Team Leader, Ji Yong said that the workshop provides the basis for planning of security operations for the Games.

“This workshop focuses mainly on Beijing Olympic experiences and to learn from them. Also, briefing of the RSIPF PG2023 Security planning and security risk analysis where security partners share ideas and experiences of security service provided at the Beijing come too.

Lead Planner of the Pacific Games Security Planning Team, Superintendent Fred Suhara said RSIPF is working closely with its security partners on the planning process, whilst also commending CPLT for the initiative in conducting the workshop for RSIP and its partners.

“The RSIPF PG23 Planning team, including RSIPF Security partners are working together, contributing towards the development of a comprehensive PG23 Security Plan.” Superintendent Suhara commended CPLT for organizing and facilitating the workshop.

“I appreciate the training offered by the CPLT with Beijing Summer and Winter Olympics experiences. This workshop is in line with the current planning process we already have in place.

“This workshop is a good chance for related sides to exchange experiences and ideas that would ensure we enjoy a safe PG2023,” Mr Suhara said.

RSIPF, CSSI take part in Honiara Clean-up

Members of the Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) and the Correctional Services of Solomon Islands (CSSI) took part in the major Honiara City clean-up to mark the launch and implementation of the Safe and Green Games Strategy, early this month.

Officers and their families from both agencies turned out in numbers to clean up their assigned areas which include; the RSIPF Police Headquarters, Rove market, Rove residential area feeder roads, Rove main road up to Ngossi and Tinge.

Similar clean-ups were conducted by officers and their families at Police Stations (Naha, Central, Henderson and White River) and Police residential areas. Also assisting in the clean-up was the Australian Federal Police (AFP) and its Policing Partnership Program (RAPPP).
