

GOC release Sol2023 Sports Schedule

With the historical 2023 XVII Pacific Games just less than four months away from reaching our shores, the Games Organizing Committee is pleased to inform the public of the Sports Schedule for this year's Games.

The schedule comprises of all 11 Games Venues and the 24 sports competitions assigned to these venues for the two-weeks duration of the Games. It also included the start and finish dates for all sports competitions.

According to the schedule Football, Basketball, Volleyball, Tennis and Table Tennis will kick off this year's Games, with their competitions starting Friday the 17th of November, two days before the Sol2023 PG Official Opening Ceremony on Sunday 19th (November).

Weightlifting, Swimming, Sailing, Rugby League 9, Golf and Judo will commence their competitions starting Monday 20th November, with the latter being the first to conclude and hand out medals the following day (Tuesday 21st November).

Tuesday will also see the start of the Archery Competition. The Rugby League 9 competition will conclude Wednesday 22nd November, whilst Thursday 23rd November will see the start of Karate and Rugby 7s competitions.

Weightlifting, Karate and Swimming conclude their competitions on Friday 24th November.

Basketball, Volleyball, Golf, Rugby 7s, Table Tennis conclude their events Saturday 25th November, whilst also coinciding is the day-long Open Water swimming competition – all of which wrap up week one of the Sol2023 Pacific Games.

Sunday 26th November is a rest day for all athletes and sports.

The much-anticipated Athletics competition kick start week two of Sol2023 (Monday 27th November) along with Netball, Boxing, Bodybuilding, Rugby Touch, Va'a and Kayaking competitions. Beach Volleyball, Hockey, Powerlifting and Taekwondo kick of competitions Tuesday 28th November –whilst Wednesday 29th November will see the start of the Triathlon competition.

Basketball 3×3 begin its competitions Thursday 30th November. Thursday also sees the conclusion of the Powerlifting event.

Athletics, Boxing and Taekwondo conclude their competitions Friday 01st December.

Events that will wrap up on Saturday 02nd December (final day of Sol2023) include; Football, Hockey, Netball, Rugby Touch, Sailing, Tennis, Triathlon, Va'a and Kayaking. The Closing Ceremony will bring down the curtains to Sol2023 PG on the evening of Saturday 02nd December, 2023.

Sogavare is overly impressed with the progress and development of the country's first ever National Stadium (NST).

The Prime Minister was given his first full tour of the new stadium which will be the core venue for this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games, Mr Sogavare conceded he was more than impressed.

"I was told that the new stadium was something special under the flood lights – I had no idea that it would be this special. Seeing is believing.

"It is indeed special to witness this magnificent icon," Prime Minister Sogavare said.

The National Stadium holds an international standard competition pitch that will be used for Ruby and Football at Games time, also a blueish international standard 400 meters synthetic running track for athletics, a 10x8 meters digital screen which will display all Games results, 24 flag poles that will hold the flags of the 24 competing nations and more than 400 floodlights that light up the stadium.

Mr Sogavare conveyed the nation's appreciation to the Government of the People's Republic of China (PRC), its Ambassador to Solomon Islands, His Excellency Li Ming and to the CCECC (China Civil Engineering Construction Corporation).

"CCECC, thank you for this wonderful facility.



"Ambassador Li Ming, I cannot thank your Government enough for this wonderful, wonderful gift to the people of Solomon Islands.

"It is both humbling and wonderful for me and my Government to witness this magnificent icon which is this stadium," Prime Minister Sogavare said.

The National Stadium look set to be completed and handed over to the National Hosting Authority by the end of August.

Meanwhile sports competitions and events that will be staged at the national stadium include; Sol2023 Official Opening Ceremony, Rugby League 9, Rugby 7s, Athletics, Football and the Sol2023 Official Closing Ceremony. These will be between November 19th to 2nd December, 2023.

Having had to endure two straight years without any major nationwide festivities due to Covid, this year's 45th Independence Anniversary celebrations was always going to be massive.

Thousands turned out, dazzled in the country's national colors of blue, yellow and green to mark the occasion. Celebrations started on the eve of Independence Day with a Thanksgiving Service at the St. Barnabas Cathedral, and on the morning of the 7th an official parade was held at a packed Lawson Tama Stadium.

A whole host of other events were held in and around the City on the day as part of the festivities. These include live music concerts staged simultaneously at different sections of Honiara, numerous sporting events and other gatherings held in almost every community throughout the City.

SOLO, the Sol2023 Pacific Games Mascot was also part of the Celebrations leading its team on an Independence Drive by, meeting and greeting communities throughout the City 'Happy 45th Independence Anniversary.'

This being Solo's first and maybe its only Independence celebration, SOLO and its team from the GOC (Games



Organizing Committee) took on the initiative of organizing an Independence drive-by, much to the delight of people in communities visited.

Meanwhile following July 7th's celebrations, Solomon Islands now sits merely four months away from hosting the historical Sol2023 Pacific Games come 19th November to 2nd December, 2023.





he 2023 Pacific Games Organizing Committee (GOC) is pleased to announce that the Vanuatu Broadcasting & Television Corporation (VBTC) has acquired the television broadcast rights for SOL2023 for Vanuatu.

Operating a free to air TV channel, and three radio stations, VBTC will be providing exclusive coverage of the games, as well as the live broadcast of the opening and closing ceremonies on VBTC's TV channel, "Television Blong Vanuatu".

Francis Herman, Chief Executive Officer for VBTC said that "VBTC is proud to have secured the exclusive rights for the Vanuatu territory and commend the GOC for its confidence in VBTC".

For the first time in its history, VBTC will provide the most extensive television and radio coverage of a Pacific Games. "Our coverage will see daily extensive coverage across all our media platforms," says Herman.

GOC will televise most sports live and will be producing a daily World Feed program of 8-10 hours of coverage. Apart from this, rights holders such as VBTC will be have access to the Venue Feeds to highlight their country's athletes' performances while providing coverage for its viewers.

Peter Stewart, CEO of the Sol2023 Games Organizing Committee, said that "The addition of VBTC to our evergrowing list of international broadcast Rights holders demonstrates the high level of interest that exists throughout the Pacific in the 2023 Pacific Games. We look forward to providing a world class broadcast product across a range of media at Games time. Out rights holders, like VBTC, are crucial to the successful delivery of this coverage."

GOC will produce over 1000 hours of coverage during the 2023 Pacific Games. Meanwhile, more details on additional rights holders as well as the Solomon Islands rights holders will be announced this month.

THE National Hosting Authority (NHA) is calling on the Solomon Islands public to take pride and look after all newly built facilities to be used at this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games.

These facilities which are funded for by donors and the national government of Solomon Islands include the National Stadium and sports venues located amidst its east and western surroundings, the football training fields and running track, the SIFF Academy, the Friendship Hall, the DC Park Marine Centre and the Solomon Islands National Institute of Sports (SINIS).

This also includes the PG2023 Games Village which comprises of a 900-bed accommodation at the Solomon Islands National University (SINU)'s main campus, and the refurbishment of dormitories and classrooms at selected schools and institutions east of Honiara City.

NHA Executive Director Christian Nieng, said the opportunity and significance of hosting the Games has allowed Solomon Islands to collaborate with its donor partners in building high-quality state-of-the-art Sporting Facilities.

Acknowledging all donor partners, Mr Nieng emphasized, "these assets bestowed upon Solomon Islands from our donor partners are crucial to the successful delivery of the Games."

"The sports venues are crucial infrastructure for successfully hosting the Games, and facilitating competitions, training sessions, and related activities.

"They will serve as the primary stages for various sporting events this year and in the future."

Mr Nieng highlighted that the opportunity and significance of hosting the Games has allowed Solomon Islands to collaborate with its donor partners in building highquality sporting facilities.

He added that it is time Solomon Islanders take pride and ownership in these facilities and help maintain it before, during and after the Sol2023 Pacific Games.

"As these facilities have been provided

through the generous support of donor partners, it is the responsibility of all individuals to take ownership of these assets and ensure their proper maintenance.

Furthermore, he urged staff and students of schools and institutions to be used as Games Villages to start taking care of the facilities that will accommodate the visiting 5000 plus Pacific Island athletes here for the Games come November and December.

Meanwhile all Games facilities are expected to be completed and handed over to NHA



Construction of new SIFF Academy on track

Work on the newly Solomon Islands Football Federation (SIFF) Academy is well on track and look to be completed within the next two months.

The National Hosting Authority (NHA) through its Facilities Committee confirmed this.

The newly built SIFF Academy is a multi-donor project co-funded for by the Government of Papua New Guinea (PNG), the Government of Japan, with support from the Solomon Islands Government.

Facilities at the SIFF Academy include;

- A Multi-Purpose Futsal Court
- Two Football (Soccer) Pitches
- Beach Soccer Field
- An Office and Administration Building
- A Dormitory
- A Changing Room

"Most of the construction work are progressing well with civil works and leveling already completed. The superstructure for the Futsal building is also close to completion," NHA Communications Manager, Douglas Saefoa confirmed.

Solomon Islands Government through NHA has acknowledged donors for the tremendous support rendered towards the project.

NHA is confident that the new home of Football will be completed by August's end, this year.

Meanwhile SIFF Academy will be a multi-sports venue during this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games. The venue will host five sports; Football, Judo, Karate, Beach Volleyball and Basketball 3x3.

According to the revised Sports Schedule, the venues and its facilities will be used starting 17th November to 30th November, 2023.

Solomon Island athletes off to China

his month (July) saw a total 80 local athletes from Solomon Islands leave for China to undergo intensive training in preparation for this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games.

The athletes were commissioned and given a formal send-off by Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare, Government Ministers and Officials and the Chinese Ambassador.... at the National Stadium on the 4th of this month.

The 80-men contingent included athletes and coaches from seven national sporting federations. They include; Athletics, Boxing, Judo, Swimming, Table Tennis, Taekwondo and Weightlifting.

The athletes are expected to undergo a three month long intensive training program aimed at boosting their physical, technical, mental capacity, with the hope of achieving improved results and performances.

Accompanying coaches will also have the opportunity to interact with Chinese counterparts and refine their coaching styles, strategies and abilities. The knowledge and experiences acquired in China will then be shared with the entire Team Solomon contingent upon their return.

NSC Chief Executive Officer, Alison Burchell said, "The training program in China will extend over a period of 90 days. It will be a focused training environment where our athletes will learn a lot about the technical aspects of their sport and help improve their confidence and results."

Burchell meanwhile commended the Government of the People's Republic of China (PRC) and the Solomon Islands Government for providing the opportunity for local athletes to fast track and enhance their preparations for the Games. The first batch of athletes left for China on the 5th of this month, whilst another two batches are expected to leave on the 8th and 12th of July.

"Having the chance to come back as a Games Ambassador and help inform, advocate, educate and share my footballing experiences to today's generation is indeed an honour for me," Timothy said.

He described the reception he and the GOC (Games Organizing Committee)'s Community Engagement team received in the province as 'heart-warming and overwhelming.

\$58m support for PG2023

PM Sogavare lauds Kingdom of Saudi Arabia support

Solomon Islands Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare has applauded the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia for its support of \$58,000,000 (SBD) grant assistance towards the Sol2023 Pacific Games.

Mr Sogavare formally conveyed the appreciation of the Government and people of Solomon Islands to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in a meeting with Saudi's Minister of State for Foreign Affairs and Climate Change Envoy, His Excellency (H.E, Adel Al-jubeir in Riyadh last month (June).

The Prime Minister said, "This assistance is indeed timely. It will directly support my Government's priority policy which include preparations and the successful hosting of the 2023 Pacific Games in Honiara from November 19 to December 2, 2023.

"The funds will be used entirely for identified preparation aspects of the Games. The Pacific Games the single largest unifying event for Solomon Islands and a uniting factor for Pacific Island countries to come together as one people," he said.

Solomon Airlines install AED devices at Honiara Airport Terminals

Pink South Pacific together with Solomon Airlines have successfully installed AED (Automated External Defibrillator) devices at the Honiara Domestic and International Arrival Terminals late last month (June).

An AED is a medical device used to help people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest.

It is a sophisticated yet easy to use device that can analyse the hearts rhythm and if necessary, deliver an electrical shock or defibrillation to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.

The devices were donated by Pink South Pacific to the people of Solomon Islands.

Geoff Hawes explained, "the importance of the AED machine is that it administers an electric shock to the body, facilitating the restoration of normal heart rhythm.

"The inclusion of this machine will play a crucial role during emergencies such as heart attacks and other injuries." The Solomon Islands Government through the Ministry of Communication and Aviation commended Pink South Pacific for its generous support and assistance in helping save lives.

Meanwhile to further enhance its emergency response capabilities, Solomon Airlines is committed to training its personnel in the operation of AED machines.

"This initiative aims to prepare and equip the airlines staff members to effectively handle potential incidents that may arise at the airport," a statement from the National Carrier stated.

300 VEHICLES NEEDED

The Sol2023 Pacific Games Organizing Committee (GOC) will be needing up to 300 plus vehicles to form its transport service at this year's Pacific Games.

As part of its plans to deliver a historic and memorable Games, GOC is committed to providing the most efficient transport service Solomon Islands can provide during Games time this year.

The services include commuting 3000 plus athletes and officials from games villages to venues and back, providing shuttles to help move the public from Games designating parking zones to venues within the Sports City, and work closely with local authorities such as Customs and the RSIPF (Royal Solomon Islands Police Force).

GOC's Head of Transport Services, Anthony Bugotu revealed that his team will be looking at hiring all types of vehicles that are available and meets Games standards and requirements, adding that these include; SUVs, Vans/Mini Vans, Buses/Mini Buses, Sedans and Trucks.

"We will need more than 300 plus vehicles at Games time. We will be needing Rav4s, X-trails, Prados, Harriers, both 15 and 30-Seater Buses, Hilux, Land Cruisers, 3-tone/2tone trucks – all that are available and meets our requirements and standards.

"These include all vehicle license and registrations and certificates (including HCC and Guadalcanal Province license and registration documents), as we also have Games Villages and Venues outside of Honiara City boundary – whereby these vehicles also need to reach and operate in," Anthony



GOC Transportation run 'Hapi Trafik Hapi Pipol' campaign

he Sol2023 Pacific Games Organizing Committee (GOC) last month (June) launched its "Hapi Trafik Hapi Pipol" campaign throughout Honiara City.

GOC Transport Supervisor, Anthony Bugotu said, "The campaign is aimed at advocating and educating the public on how we all can help alleviate the issue of traffic congestion faced throughout Honiara City.

"This will be crucial to the successful delivery of this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games come November and December this year."

Anthony added that the primary objective of the campaign is to try and help address the issue of traffic

congestion by advocating ways in which we road users can contribute to alleviating the problem.

"Since its launch, we have conducted awareness programs right throughout Honiara City. Our focus was to help road users better understand traffic rules and to observe them as the best means of avoiding unwanted accidents and traffic congestions," he said.

As part of this initiative, Anthony highlighted that GOC Transportation is inviting vehicle owners to participate in the Games Transportation Service by responding to the EOI (Expression of Interest) released 13th June, 2023.

"We encourage interested individuals to apply and be part of our Games Transport Fleet that will provide the most efficient transport service we can provide during the Games," he said.

Meanwhile the deadline for the EOI is 31st July, 2023.

CCECC confirm scale down of local staff

he SOL2023 National Hosting Authority (NHA) is working closely with contractors that have completed their projects and are now beginning to scale down their staff numbers. One of the main contractors that provided employment for local Solomon Islands families is the China Civil Engineering Construction Corporation (CCECC).

At the weekend, the CCECC commenced its staff redundancy exercise now that their projects are drawing closer to completion. Four hundred (400) CCECC workers were given question and answer session by the Office of the NHA and the Commissioner of Labour. All the employee's queries were answered and their concerns taken on board. The NHA is concerned about the level of misinformation among the local workers but the supervisors have been working hard to properly explain and inform all employees about the processes and procedures for redundancy payments.

NHA and labour confirmed that the process taken by CCECC and the final emoluments of the first 130 employees to be made redundant is fair according to employment act and NHA is satisfied that the local workers were paid satisfactorily. NHA is also very pleased with the high standard of discipline displayed by local workers worked in the course of their work on the 2023 Pacific Games Stadium Projects.

However, it is acknowledged that the contractor CCECC has been putting up with isolated theft incidents involving local staff.

Just at the weekend, one or two local CCECC staff broke into the CCECC storeroom at the national stadium and stole three grinders, 6 Led lights plus some cash. At the same time few doors, toilet partitions and a hand basin were vandalised. This action is not representative of all good local employees who are proud of their role in the construction of the 2023 Pacific Games Stadium Project.

The thief who may also have vandalised the property escaped unnoticed. The incident had been reported to the police who are now involved in investigating the incident that will bring the culprit to face justice.

NHA clarify PG2023 Workers Engagement

he 2023 Pacific Games National Hosting Authority (NHA) has come out to clarify the engagement period of all its employees and that of all Committees working towards delivering the Games this year.

NHA Chair Dr Jimmie Rodgers said, "the PG2023 Project is timebound and so there is time for all employees to leave work before the NHA winds up operations."

Dr Rodgers revealed that this also applied to all contracted firms and their employees who have to wind down immediately after completion of their various projects.

"Initially, the NHA started the Secretariat with a small team. The staffing grew as requirements for contractors and workforce grew based on needs to construct Games venues, prepare athletes, and the delivery of the Games requirements for the 5000 athletes and 24 sports that will be delivered for the 2023 Pacific Games.

"Most of the employees will finish work by the end of December 2023 while very few will remain to manage the closure of all NHA operations."

Dr Rodgers advised all employees and contractors that it is the Government's Policy to ensure contractors engaged are reputable companies with good track records.

"All NHA employees must adhere to NHA policies and Contractors and Managers must treat all their employees fairly.

"It is a wonderful opportunity and privilege to be part of the NHA team and its contractors to prepare and deliver Games Villages, Venues and Operations for this year's Sol2023 Pacific Games," Dr Rodgers said.

NHA meanwhile encouraged all its employees to keep up the good work that will see Solomon Islands successfully deliver the Sol2023 Pacific Games come November and December this year.
